African Lion Fact Sheet

Common name: African Lion Scientific name: Panthera leo Size: Male lions weigh 150-250 kg, while females weigh around 110-180 kg. Diet: Lions are carnivores and mainly hunt large animals like zebras, buffaloes, and wildebeests.

Habitat: African lions live in grasslands, savannas, and open woodlands across sub-Saharan Africa.



African lions are large, powerful cats that live in the grasslands and savannas of Africa. They are known as "apex predators," meaning they are at the top of the food chain.

Lions have the strongest social behaviours of any cats species, living in groups called **prides** or **coalitions**. A pride can have more than 30 lions! There is a core group of female lions that are related to each other, and their cubs, as well as a coalition of male lions. A coalition is a group of 2 - 3 males lions. Usually they are either young lions who haven't established a pride yet, or old males who have had their pride taken over by another coalition.

Male lions are easy to recognise because of their thick, furry manes. Females are usually smaller and faster, making them better hunters.

Lions are obligate hunters, which means they cannot properly digest plants. To obtain proper nutrients they must hunt animals like zebras, wildebeests, and antelopes. The lionesses are the main hunters, working together to catch prey, while the males protect the pride and their territory. If there are cubs with the pride, 1 or 2 lionesses will stay behind to look after all of the cubs in a creche, while the rest of the pride hunts.

apex predator - an animal at the top of the food chain, with no natural predators, like lions or sharks coalition - a group of male lions that may or may not control a pride creche - a group of similarly aged, but not always related young animals (like lion cubs) that are cared for together by several adults grasslands - large, open areas covered mostly with grass, where many animals live, like zebras and lions mane - the thick, long fur around a male lion's neck, which makes them look larger and provides protection during fights obligate hunter - an animal that must eat meat to survive, like lions or cats **prey** - animals that are hunted and eaten by predators, like antelopes are prey for lions pride - a family group of lions that live and hunt together, made up of females, cubs, and one or two males savanna - a type of habitat with both grasslands and scattered trees, found in places like Africa where lions live
