
Take Action: Formulating questions

Use the **Question Quadrant template** below to generate a range of questions about your chosen topic related to homelessness (housing, trauma, or women). Aim to include at least one question per quadrant.



Example: Question quadrant

Text

Comprehension questions are based on what students have learned to help expand upon their understanding.

For example: In 2022-2023, what percentage of specialist homelessness agency clients were female?

Speculation questions focus on creative solutions or approaches to address perceived challenges.

For example: If the government committed to providing women experiencing homelessness with safe and secure housing, what would happen?

Closed

Research questions delve deeper into the reasons or implications behind the statistics, which often require the help of experts.

For example: How does the representation of women among specialist homelessness agency clients reflect broader societal issues?

Enquiry questions focus on the big picture, usually having multiple answers and reflecting

personal experiences, values and perspectives.

For example: Should the primary focus of addressing homelessness be on immediate support or on resolving underlying social issues such as family violence and mental health?
