Adam's parents separated when he was four years old and spent his primary school years in South Australia where he enjoyed playing soccer. He started playing Australian Rules Football when he moved to Victoria and couldn't find a local junior soccer club to join. Growing up, Adam did not appreciate the significance of his Aboriginal cultural heritage. It was only once he moved to Sydney, and became friends with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders, that he felt the need to find out more about his family's story and where he had come from. This led him to completing TAFE studies in Indigenous Studies, sparking a newfound understanding and appreciation of his history and culture.
